A WORD FROM OUR CEO

Dear Martha & Mary Supporters,

2010 was a very productive year for Martha & Mary as we continued to focus on the strategic direction (see next page) that was adopted by our Board of Trustees and embraced by our management team in 2007.

While a skittish economy has proven challenging with government reimbursements, it has been fertile ground for recruiting new talent into the organization, which is helping us to enhance our existing operations while repositioning our senior services to more effectively carry out the mission.

It was a breakout year for our home and community service programs as Martha & Mary acquired Abiding Home Care in December. This acquisition in combination with our previous acquisition of Angel Advocates has allowed us to merge three talented organizations into Martha & Mary AT HOME. With over 100 employees and 100 customers

from Gig Harbor to Bainbridge Island, AT HOME will become a significant part of our financial operations.

Besides home care services, we expect housing and rehab services to continue to grow as we reposition Martha & Mary for the future. Both these areas also moved forward in new and exciting ways in 2010.

Important milestones were reached for our new affordable senior housing campus in Kingston as we secured key financing and formalized a joint venture relationship with Shelter Resources Inc. The new venture created a Limited Liability Limited Partnership (LLLP) known as Kingston Village Green Associates. The engineers and architects will be finalizing plans in 2011 with our Village Green campus partners and we expect to be breaking ground on our portion of that exciting new campus no later than the spring of 2012.

With our recently expanded and renovated rehab facilities in Poulsbo,

our rehab program continued to grow and demonstrate positive outcomes for our customers. With those results come opportunities. In 2010 we developed strong alliances with cardiac surgeons, who are committed to knowing that their patients receive efficient and effective post-acute care that allows them to successfully return home without complications.

Regarding rehab, we continue to keep an eye to the future as we look at potential expansion beyond Poulsbo. In 2010 we engaged the Alford Group in conjunction with about 80 community leaders to help us evaluate future growth options. The results and recommendations of that work are being evaluated by our Board of Trustees in 2011 and corresponding planning based on those decisions will follow.

When an organization is blessed and supported by the community with financial, volunteer, and prayerful support the way that Martha & Mary has been, it allows for some

exciting opportunities to grow the effectiveness of our mission to families in the West Sound.

Thank you for investing in Martha & Mary so Martha & Mary can grow that investment to better serve our communities throughout the region.

The important work done by this staff in 2010 was celebrated when they received the Home Care Pulse's "Best of Home Care" distinction. Awarded to the top 25% of agencies in client and employee satisfaction

scores from Home Care Pulse, Martha & Mary AT HOME is now ranked among a select few of the best agencies in the country.

We continue to specialize in non-medical services like companionship, medication reminders, meal preparation, light housekeeping, assistance with bathing and grooming, errands and transportation. In addition, we are currently providing families with technology for improved safety including VoiceCare®, a personal emergency response system that provides a convenient and accessible way to summon help and MedSmart®, an automated medication dispenser that safely organizes and reminds clients that it is time to take medications. Being able to benchmark our clinical results for quality, efficiency, and effectiveness is becoming more important in today's healthcare environment. We're proud of our results in 2010 at the Health & Rehab Center in Poulsbo:

- Rehab patients are returning home almost four days sooner when they choose to receive post-acute care from Martha & Mary vs. other providers in the state.
- Our partnership with Evercare continues to prove that the comprehensive model of care both organizations has adopted can effectively reduce hospitalizations and unnecessary trips to the emergency room

by as much as 50%. This voluntary program continues to gain new enrollees each year as families like the benefits of an on-site nurse practitioner.

- We received zero deficiencies in our annual state survey which is very uncommon for a campus the size of Martha & Mary. In fact, only about 5% of the skilled nursing facilities nationally receive such a score. A zero-deficiency survey does not suggest perfection, but it is a special achievement that recognizes the tremendous amount of energy, coordination, skill, and heart that contributes to the care provided to those we serve.

Our ability to maintain 24-hour coverage by RNs and the commitment of having our own rehab therapist on staff to provide therapy seven days a week versus using contract workers like others proved to be very effective in 2010. We have a solid foundation to build upon so we can continue to serve those we care for like family.

A grant from Kitsap Commission on Children and Youth provided two farm shares which the children visited weekly, feeding the animals and choosing produce to prepare and eat.

The North Kitsap Soroptimists awarded a grant for on-going parent education and training, which has been well-received. Providing dinner and free child care removes the barriers preventing young families from attending.

Additionally, we offered free meals to children through the USDA Simplified Summer Feeding Program. Through this program offered in partnership Emmanuel Apostolic Church, Poulsbo Elementary and Cougar Valley Elementary, we were able to reach families from West Bremerton to North Kitsap.

SENIOR HOUSING



Martha & Mary continues to offer housing for independent seniors in Poulsbo and is also looking to expand its housing offerings to the heart of Kingston for independent seniors looking for affordable housing options.

The joint venture between Martha & Mary and Shelter Resources Inc. (a for-profit developer specializing in affordable senior housing) was solidified in 2010 as a new entity, Village Green Kingston Associates, LLLP was formed. This new entity will be instrumental in helping ensure a new 35-unit apartment complex for low-income seniors gets built in the next couple years.

The vision for this development in Kingston has been on the minds of North Kitsap community leaders for a number of years. Martha & Mary is proud to be one of many local organizations, including Kitsap County itself, partnering together to make the Village Green multi-use campus a reality. In addition to affordable senior housing, the master plan for the Village Green campus includes improved parks, a new library, and new community center which will be offering intergenerational programs to both seniors and youth (Boys and Girls Club).

2010 proved to be successful not only with formalizing the joint venture agreement but also securing allocations of HOME and County 2060 funding. These efforts are paving the way for eventual tax credit allocations in 2011 to complete the needed financing which will be the last milestone before beginning construction.
