Important community partnerships played a prominent role throughout Martha & Mary over the past year. In 2017, we participated in two highly competitive processes to renew service agreements: 1) with the North Kitsap School District for Before and After School Services in the district's elementary schools; and 2) with the Bremerton Housing Authority for management services at Bay Vista Commons. We were successfully awarded both contracts—a major achievement for 2017! Partnerships like these are integral to our success in continuing to meet current and emerging community needs. On behalf of

our Board of Trustees, it is my honor to thank all our healthcare, education and community partners in caring—organizations that we have trusted and relied on for many years to meet our mission of caring.

With the award of \$1 million from Washington State Department of Commerce's Building Communities Fund, we are now able to complete the infrastructure renovation of our aging skilled nursing campus in Poulsbo. Throughout 2017, Board and staff leadership worked diligently alongside our Washington State legislators to ensure this \$1 million in grant funding was included in the State's capital budget. Efforts continued right up until the end of the year, and in January 2018, funding was formally approved. We are especially grateful to Sen. Christine Rolfes, Rep. Sherry Appleton, Rep. Steve Tharinger and Sen. Kevin Van der Wege for their hard work and commitment to West Sound seniors and their families. This transformational investment will have a lasting impact on the community. As we continue to implement national best practices in senior care supported by this comprehensive renovation, our ability to meet the needs of Kitsap's rapidly aging population is ensured.

On behalf of the Martha & Mary Board of Trustees, our sincere thanks to all donors, volunteers, clients, family members, business partners and more for your on-going support of our organization. Together, we will continue to meet the growing care needs of our community's elders and children, and the families who love them.

At Martha & Mary KIDS, 2017 efforts led to important achievements that have enhanced our affordable, high-quality early learning and school-age programs.

All three childcare centers proudly maintained their Quality Level of Excellence rating from Early Achievers. This quality rating and improvement system recognizes our robust teaching team and the essential early learning experiences they offer for Pre-K children.

During the past year we renewed our partnerships with both the North Kitsap and Central Kitsap school districts with outstanding before and after school and summer enrichment programming. Our focus on global learning was strengthened by a special visit from Francis Njuakom Nchii of Cameroon, Africa. He captivated students with descriptions of life and hardships in his small village. This rich, ongoing international partnership offers important “lessons for life” for children in our program.

Summer Program students explored fairy tales with a “techie” twist, blending fun, science and math. Thanks to the purchase of a new transport van, their summertime learning featured more field trips and enrichment opportunities.

With child-centered learning as our foundation, Martha & Mary KIDS is helping raise the next generation of Kitsap children.

Improving the “patient experience” during rehab therapy was a top priority during 2017. With technology being introduced into healthcare at a rapid pace, our rehab program incorporated two new systems to help patients engage with therapy and get better quicker.

Jintronix is one of the new rehabilitation technologies that made its debut in the Martha & Mary REHAB in Kitsap County to incorporate this video game system, which combines cutting-edge motion sensors with video games to transform physical therapy into a fun and interactive experience for patients.

Another innovative platform Martha & Mary implemented during 2017 is called “It’s Never 2 Late,” which is geared for older adults who may have had limited exposure to personal computers in the past. This picture-based system uses a touch screen interface, and it is especially user friendly for our REHAB patients undergoing occupational and speech therapy as part of their recovery plan.

We believe the use of these new systems increases patient involvement in their healthcare and improves health outcomes. Martha & Mary will continue to bring new technology to our rehab therapy, in keeping with our commitment to help our community’s elders remain independent as long as possible.

THERAPY SERVICES

Our experienced and effective physical, occupational and speech therapy team offers rehabilitation therapy seven days a week, earning our post-acute recovery program a reputation for getting patients home sooner than most providers and reducing the likelihood of their hospital re-admittance.

NURSING SERVICES

Nurses and Nursing Assistants on our Rehab Unit work as a team to provide patient-focused care with a clear understanding that successful recovery results from treatment that addresses both the physical ailments of our clients and their intellectual, emotional and spiritual concerns.

TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

To maintain the high quality of our rehabilitation program, we make training a priority for our nursing team, to enhance their technical skills, increase their care knowledge and ensure they utilize new and emerging “best practices.” Several times a year, Training and Development offers a free training program, open to the community, that prepares students for the state exam and a career as a Certified Nursing Assistant.

HOME CARE

We offer exceptional and award-winning care to seniors throughout the Greater Kitsap region, allowing them to remain independent, safe and secure in the comfort of their own homes. Skilled and compassionate caregivers provide assistance a few hours a week or every day. Care can include medication reminders, transportation, meal preparation, light housekeeping, personal care, hygiene assistance, memory support and companionship.

HEALTH HOME

By providing care management services to high-risk Medicaid patients, we can help ensure they receive appropriate care in the most cost-effective setting. Operating under a “whole-person” philosophy, we work to improve care quality and to increase an individual’s participation in their own care. The benefits of this program result in significant reductions in hospital readmissions, emergency room visits and the need for nursing home care.

GERIATRIC CARE MANAGEMENT

Knowledgeable about health care costs, availability and service quality, in addition to housing options, well-being programs and financial/legal planning, our Geriatric Care Management team offers families guidance, care coordination and patient advocacy, helping them to make appropriate care choices and housing placements for their loved ones.

Another major achievement in 2017 was conversion to a new electronic health records system called PointClickCare. An interdisciplinary group from Nursing and Finance worked diligently to convert all resident and patient information. This new system integrates clinical, financial, and operational activities to better manage care, service outcomes, and budgets.

All census projections point to a substantial increase in older adults in our region. Martha & Mary is committed to meeting the care needs of seniors and families with our trusted long-term, memory and rehab care. We are honored to help seniors maintain their quality of life and bring families peace of mind through our mission of caring.

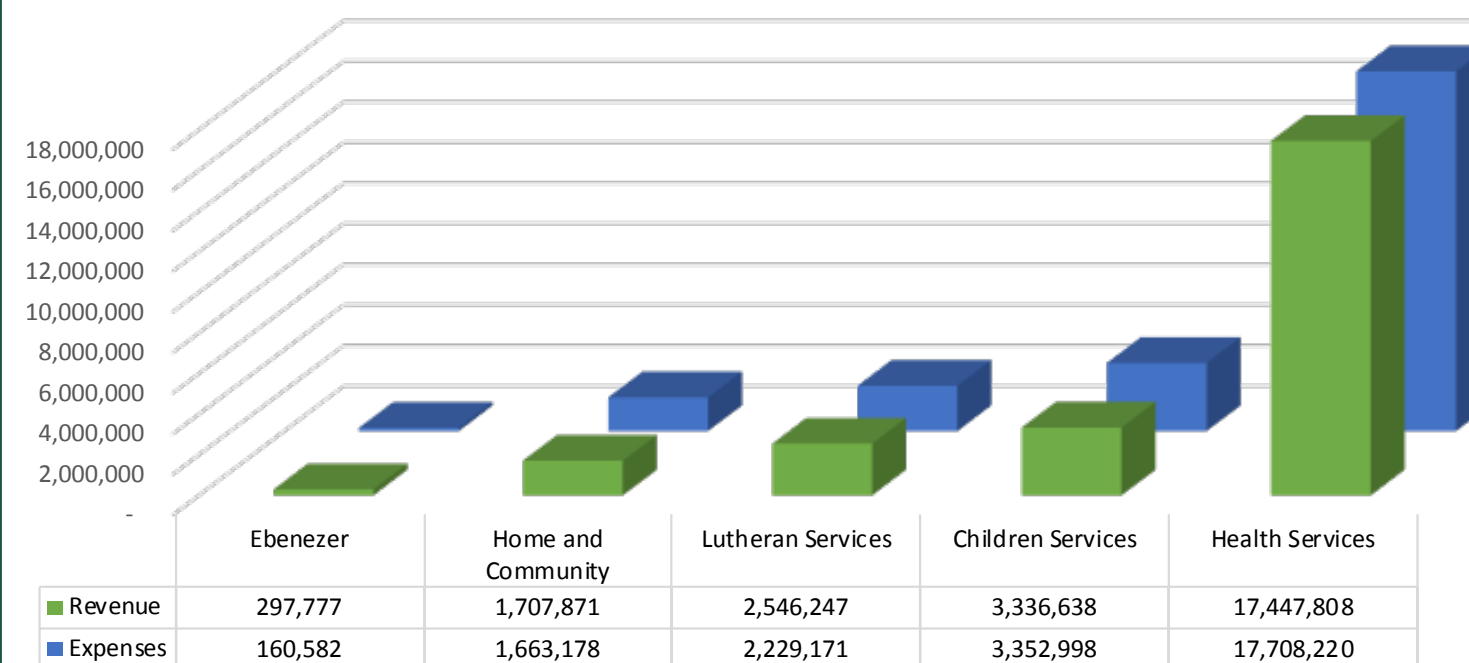

MARTHA & MARY 2017 DONOR APPRECIATION PHILANTHROPY AWARDS

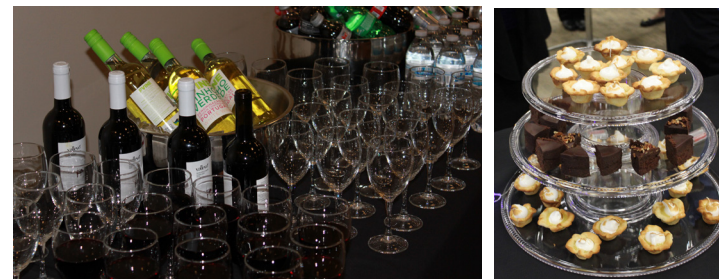

The Kitsap County Block Grant Program received a 2017 Philanthropy Award in honor of the significant impact its funding has made on Martha & Mary and our capacity to improve and maintain our care facilities for children and seniors. These funds help address the needs of low-income and special needs households. Since 2000, Martha & Mary has received almost \$400,000 in support from the CDBG program and approximately \$700,000 from related programs. A loyal and generous donor, Julie Lightfoot was recognized with a 2017 Philanthropy Award for her more than 40 years' of involvement with Martha & Mary.
