### **Nominations to the Board of Trustees – First 3-Year Term**

#### **Bill Baird**

William John Baird joined the Martha & Mary Board of Trustees in 2019, bringing with him over 30 years of professional experience in healthcare finance.

Bill's work in the healthcare field began at First Interstate Bank in 1982, where he developed a portfolio of healthcare clients that included hospitals, HMOs and senior retirement communities. In 1992, he joined the Board of Pacific Clinics, a non-profit organization providing outpatient psychiatric care to children and adults in the San Gabriel Valley in California. He began serving as the Assistant Treasurer for Catholic Healthcare West (CHW) in 1998, during which time he became an active member of the Finance Committee of Elder Care Alliance, a joint venture between the Sisters of Mercy and the Bay Area Lutheran Synod, and participated as a Board Member for Kokoro Assisted Living in San Francisco.
